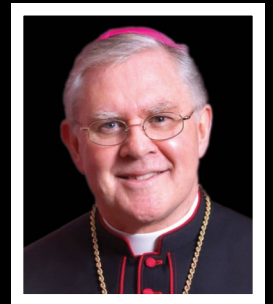

KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

Archbishop Mark Coleridge

Born in Melbourne in 1948, Archbishop Mark Coleridge was ordained priest in Melbourne in 1974. He served in parishes before studying Scripture at the Pontifical Biblical Institute in Rome. He taught Scripture in Melbourne, where he was eventually made Master of Catholic Theological College. In late 1997, he was appointed to work in the Holy See's Secretariat of State. He was ordained Auxiliary Bishop of Melbourne in 2002 and named Archbishop of Canberra and Goulburn in 2006. In 2012 he was appointed Metropolitan Archbishop of Brisbane where he currently serves. In 2016 he was also appointed Vice-President of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference.



Father Warren Kinne SSC

Warren was born in Bundaberg and lived there until he graduated from High School. After seven years in the Columban Seminary in Melbourne and Sydney, he was posted to Mindanao in the Philippines for most of the 1970s. Warren did post-graduate studies in the Gregorian University in Rome and received a PhD in ecclesiology at the Arts Faculty of the University of Birmingham, UK. In 2017 he returned to Australia after 20 years in China and 40 of the past 47 years working overseas. In Shanghai he taught as a visiting Professor in the School of Philosophy, Fudan University for 10 years. He was also a founding member of You Dao Foundation and its first Chairman. This registered NGO works with internal migrant workers in Shanghai. Currently Warren is Chaplain of Griffith University, Gold Coast Campus.
